Students must meet the following criteria:

- Completing or have a minimum Grade 12 diploma (2015); AND
- 2) Enrolling in first year, at a full time post-secondary trade program at an accredited undergraduate college/university related to the construction trades; OR
- Enrolling in first year, at a professional program at an accredited undergraduate college/university related to the construction industry (such as civil/structural engineering or engineering technology, architecture, etc.)

What to Include?

- 4) Letter from one of the following:
 - Relevant institution confirming acceptance in an accredited undergraduate college or university, trade or professional program.
 - b) Employer/Sponsor confirming that you have been or will be hired as an apprentice and will be enrolling in an accredited facility in the near future.
- Summary of Volunteer Hours, including amount of hours achieved to date and description of where and what tasks/accomplishments were completed while volunteering.
